Integrative Treatment Of Trauma & Addiction

Michael Genovese

MD, JD and Chief Medical Officer of Sierra Tucson

This stimulating presentation examines the benefits of integrative treatment for trauma and addiction and the interplay of genetics and environment and their effects on brain development.

Michael Genovese, MD, JD, is the chief medical officer of Sierra Tucson, a world leader in integrative health. He is assistant clinical professor of medicine at the University of Arizona, a diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology, and a member of the American Psychiatric Association and the American Academy of Addiction Psychiatry. Before joining Sierra Tucson, Dr. Genovese co-founded a highly successful medical practice bringing state-of-the-art integrative treatments to metropolitan New York patients. He also practiced as an attending physician at nearby Winthrop University Hospital and served as a fellow at the New York University/North Shore University Hospital Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Program. He completed his residency training at the University of Connecticut School of Medicine.

Before beginning his medical studies, Dr. Genovese earned a Juris Doctor degree at the University of Pittsburgh School of Law. He is a member of the New York Bar and the American Bar Association, and he maintains a special counsel relationship with the law firm of Sullivan & Sullivan LLP, in Garden City, New York. He is an advocate for attorneys seeking treatment for addiction and co-occurring disorders.
